TRANSIT DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Westmoreland County strives to attract, develop and retain a diverse and stable workforce that will sustain a healthy economy. To ensure Westmoreland County remains vibrantly connected for decades to come, Westmoreland County Transit Authority (WCTA), in partnership with the Pennsylvania Department of Transportation (PennDOT), is conducting a planning process to evaluate and update transit services to meet the community's mobility needs better. The Transit Development Plan (TDP) will be an opportunity to evaluate and update our services to respond to changes in demand.



The TDP will serve as a strategic blueprint for improvements to transit service for Westmoreland County over the next several years. This plan will evaluate travel demands, identify future public transportation needs, and make recommendations to connect our thriving communities and residents to the places they want to go.

- Evaluates current transportation conditions

- Assesses opportunities for innovation in public transit
- · Creates a blueprint for short, medium, and long-term transit improvements in Westmoreland County
